

REGISTERED LEAGUE SHOOTING RULES

- 1. Registered league shooting shall be subject to and governed by the Official Trapshooting Rules issued by the Amateur Trapshooting Association. In these rules the word "shoot" and/or "tournament" is intended to include Registered Leagues unless an exception is made for league's within same.
- 2. In the event of any conflict between registered league shooting rules and any other official rules of the ATA the official ATA rules shall take precedence and shall apply.
- 3. Registered league shooting shall apply to 16-yard singles targets and **doubles**.
- 4. To constitute a registered league at least three (3) or more persons must compete and complete a minimum of 250 sixteen-yard singles targets or 250 <u>doubles</u> targets during a minimum period of 5 consecutive weeks.
- 5. The actual number of targets broken and total number of league target shots will be recorded with no consideration given to shooter handicap adjustments.
- 6. A registered league shooter choosing to register scores must first become either an annual or life member of the Amateur Trapshooting Association.
- 7. A registered league shooter must pay a one time only \$2.00 league fee for his actual score registration. A portion of this \$2.00 fee shall be rebated to the State Association in the same manner as ATA daily fees.
- 8. All registered league targets shall be counted toward requirements for the Grand American Championship and for all other ATA registered tournaments.
- 9. All registered league targets shall be counted for purposes of target attainment accomplishments.
- 10. Registered league scores and averages shall be listed on a separate line on the ATA average card. Year end registered league averages shall be reported for publication in the Annual Average Book.

11. Registered League Application procedures:

- A. Application for registered league shooting must be made on an application form approved and supplied by the ATA and each form must be fully completed before submission.
- B. Upon submitting an application, registered league due of \$25.00 and the official league rules and regulations must accompany that application.
- C. The respective State Association Secretary must have previously approved the application.
- D. An individual member must indicate his intent to register league scores to the league secretary by proving ATA membership and submitting a \$2.00 League registration fee.

12. League Secretary follow-up:

- A. The ATA league report must be filed, reporting registered targets shot with complete names, addresses, ATA card numbers, accurate scores, membership applications and financial accounting.
- B. Names and addresses of those paying ATA dues during league activity.
- C. A check for individual ATA league fees (\$2.00 per member collected during the league).
- D. This complete report must be mailed 8 days following the last day of the registered league to avoid a \$25.00 late shoot report fine which if not paid will be deducted from the State rebate in which the shoot is held.
- E. Send the required reports to the State Associations.
